S05: Identifying and Addressing Food Insecurity in Military Members and Families: A Panel Discussion

In 2006, USDA introduced new language to describe ranges of severity of food insecurity. USDA made these changes in response to recommendations of an expert panel convened at USDA's request by the Committee on National Statistics (CNSTAT) of the National Academies. Although new labels were introduced, the methods used to assess households' food security remained unchanged, so statistics for 2005 to now are directly comparable with those for earlier years. The National Defense Authorization Act for fiscal year 2020 directed the Secretary of Defense to report on food insecurity among members of the armed forces and their dependents. The directive includes the following elements: an assessment of the current extent of food insecurity among not only service members and their dependents but also those living on post and presumably not receiving the basic allowance for housing (BAH) and three sets of recommendations (for policies, programs, and activities) to address food insecurity among military families. In accordance with the authority in DoD Directive 5124.02, this issuance establishes policy, assigns responsibilities, and prescribes procedures and requirements for supporting military family readiness (MFR) through a system that maximizes access to a network of programs and services that promotes MFR, hereinafter referred to in this issuance as the Military Family Readiness System (MFRS).
