- 4. Outline the components of effective PCM feedback.
- 5. Identify required components of a follow-up BHC appointment.
- 6. Differentiate between the specialty behavioral health role versus that of a behavioral health consultant (BHC).
- 7. Identify an approach to ethical decision-making in primary care settings.
- 8. Outline an efficient warm handoff workflow.
- 9. Review 3 outcomes of a warm handoff: "Meet-and-Greet" interaction, Abbreviated Visit, and "Standard Visit".
- 10. Implement teamwork strategies in your clinic.
- 11. Select an appropriate level of detail for presentations based on setting and time available.
- 12. Assess a patient with suicidal ideation to determine level of risk and appropriate setting of care.
- 13. Understand strategies to optimize utilization of BHC services.
