- 3. Design a holistic and inclusive plan of care for patients with limb loss, incorporating psychological, social, and physical rehabilitation strategies.
- 4. Examine the cognitive, emotional, and social challenges that individuals face following limb loss, and identify evidence-based holistic interventions to facilitate recovery.
- 5. Understand how visual art, music, and dance/movement therapies can be utilized for physical and psychological rehabilitation, particularly for military and veteran populations.
- 6. Apply various creative arts-based interventions, including art therapy, music therapy, and dance/movement therapy, to support emotional regulation, social connectedness, and overall well-being in clinical settings.
