### **Family Advocacy Staff Training Advanced Course – Prevention**

#### **Continuing Education (CE)/Continuing Medical Education (CME) Information**

**Course Description:** This advanced prevention training course equips clinical staff with evidence-based strategies to recognize, address, and prevent abuse within military settings. Participants will examine risk factors, relationship dynamics, trauma-informed approaches, and public health prevention models while exploring practical interventions that support client safety and readiness.

##### **Learning Objectives:**

1. Explain the Family Advocacy Program (FAP) Prevention's Mission.
2. Differentiate between awareness campaigns and skill-building activities.
3. Identify a resource for implementing an effective prevention activity.
4. Explain the role of collaboration in developing effective prevention strategies.
5. Summarize how the fatality reviews process shifts the focus from individual incidents responses to identifying systemic gaps and trends.
6. Apply the Public Health Approach to prevention approach and strategies through mock fatality reviews.
7. Identify individual behavior that contributes to conflict in relationships.
8. Outline skills to help individuals and couples implement healthy behaviors to minimize the risk of conflict and abuse.
9. Discuss conflict resolution models and safety planning strategies to their clients.
10. Analyze the impact of limited staffing on client service delivery and program outcomes.
11. Identify effective strategies and services that support care delivery in a resource-limited environment.
12. Explain how drug misuse affects the immature brain and define high potency THC (Tetrahydrocannabinol).
13. Identify loopholes regarding synthetic cannabinoids.
