Interprofessional Continuing Education (IPCE)



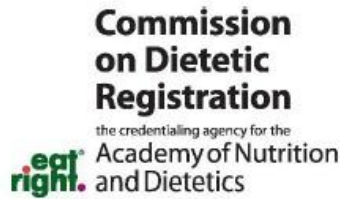
